# COSTA RICA: Spring Break Service Adventure

Make a meaningful impact this spring break as you experience the culture of Costa Rica and its "pura vida" lifestyle while giving back to a rural beach community and the ecosystem.

# **OVERVIEW**

On this program you will experience spring break in a whole new way! Lend a hand on projects that support the local community and the natural world. Costa Rica is a breathtaking and culturally rich country; however, some communities and habitats still need some extra support, and your efforts can be a big help. Become a true steward for the environment as you support meaningful conservation projects in one of the most biodiverse places on earth. You'll also have the chance to meet and interact with members of your host community during your week abroad. It's not spring break without a bit of adventure, and Costa Rica has an ample supply for everyone! You'll have the chance to enjoy time in nature, have fun in the sun, experience ziplining through the jungle and participate in other activities with your new friends from all over the world.

Home Base is a comfortable family-owned hotel located in Playa Junquillal, a small coastal town known for its beautiful beaches and protected ecological areas. You'll have access to a pool and be surrounded by nature. Students stay in gender-segregated dorm-style rooms with 4-8 per room. Rooms are equipped with bunk beds and have en-suite bathrooms, hot water, and air conditioning.

# SPOTLIGHT ON COMMUNITY SERVICE

Students will work on a variety of environmental conservation projects alongside a local non-profit organization dedicated to protecting the area's watersheds and tropical dry forest. There are many opportunities to serve the community here. For example, you may assist in environmental action projects such as collecting seeds and planting native tree saplings, erosion prevention, or creating signs to promote environmental awareness and sustainability. You could work on green initiatives within local schools, such as assisting with planting and maintenance in the school garden. Learn how small changes can have big impacts in sustainability and your role in environmental stewardship.

# SAMPLE ITINERARY: DAILY BREAKDOWN

Actual schedule of activities will vary by program session. The information detailed here is typical for what you can expect to experience; however, service work and activities vary depending upon the needs of our local community partners, various celebrations and customs, as well as the weather and specific needs of the student group.



## DAY 1: WELCOME TO COSTA RICA!

Fly into Liberia (LIR) on the first day of the program, where GLA staff will be ready to welcome you and take you to our Home Base, a quaint family-owned and operated hotel on the shores of the Pacific coast. Rest up after a long day of travel and take in your first Costa Rican sunset from the beach. We'll start getting to know our fellow travelers and GLA staff at a brief orientation. Get settled and enjoy your first delicious Costa Rican dinner at Home Base.









#### **DAY 2: GETTING ORIENTED**

We'll kick off our time together with group team building activities, utilizing the gardens, pools, sport fields and sandy beaches around us. You'll also familiarize yourself with your community service site. Meet with the service site leaders and local neighbors to learn about the local Guanacaste culture, geographic terrain and environmental status of the region you'll be working in.

In the afternoon, enjoy swimming in the warm tropical waves and play some beach games. Visit the local sea turtle hatchery and learn about how conservation efforts are increasing sea turtle populations. With some luck, witness a baby sea turtle release! After a delicious dinner, we'll participate in our first Mentor Group sessions and leadership activities.

## DAYS 3 & 5: COMMUNITY SERVICE & CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

The projects will vary based on the needs of the community and the service partner organizations at the time of the students' arrival.

Work with local non-profit, Guanacaste Water Center, to make an impact by replenishing deforested areas with new trees. Tend to saplings that are being prepared for replanting, plant trees in the field and maintain existing reforestation projects to improve their survival rate. Planting trees and rebuilding a forest cover is critical to retaining rainwater instead of losing it to runoff, and protecting the land from erosion and drought. You may also lend a hand at a nearby school garden, playground, or community resource center, helping with renovation or construction work. Helping improve these facilities gives the surrounding communities safe and beautiful spaces for play, gathering and education.

In the afternoon, enjoy a traditional cooking class and prepare a Costa Rican recipe in a traditional Guanacaste wood burning oven. Then pick up the pace to some tropical salsa and merengue tunes in a dance class led by a local dance instructor.

# DAY 4: ZIPLINE ADVENTURE & BEACH DAY

We'll soar in the canopy and enjoy nature from cables in the treetops. Challenge yourself on multiple exhilarating ziplines, all designed to give you an unforgettable experience while safely soaring through the forest. With some focus and a little luck, spot monkeys and tropical birds as you fly by!

Try boogie boarding some warm waves at a pristine white sand beach. Play some beach soccer and volleyball with your new friends, or relax in a hammock under the palm trees.

# DAY 6: SNORKELING & CATAMARAN RIDE

Time for a true Pura Vida adventure day! After breakfast, we'll board a cruising catamaran sail boat to a beautiful snorkeling spot, where the water is extremely clear and warm year-round. We'll explore a different world underwater, among friendly schools of fish and colorful coral. Take a swim and relax on the white-sand beaches that the Guanacaste region of Costa Rica is famous for. In the evening, enjoy a final farewell celebration and meal together at our Home Base. Capture memories with your friends of the last Costa Rican sunset of your trip!



#### **DAY 7: DEPARTURE**

Say see you soon, or "hasta pronto" to your new friends as your Costa Rica experience comes to an end. Reflect on all of the incredible times with your peers and staff. We'll travel as a group back to Guanacaste International Airport in Liberia, where GLA staff will help you check in for your flight and see you off on your journey home. We hope that you have enjoyed the week of service, learning, and unforgettable adventure on your GLA program.

# TRAVELING TO COSTA RICA

GLA HOME BASE | Home Base is located in a coastal region of Costa Rica known for its beautiful beaches and protected ecological areas. Students will have access to a pool, large outdoor spaces, tables and chairs in covered areas and a stretch of private beach half a mile away. Students are permitted to visit the beach at the staff's discretion and with supervision. The group will stay in gender-segregated rooms with roommates, and have private bathrooms and air conditioning.

FOOD | Costa Rica is known for its simple diet of rice, beans and a side of meat. The food at Home Base will reflect the traditional dietary staples of the people in Costa Rica. It will be simple, but fresh and healthy and include delicious, locally-grown fruits.

CLIMATE | March - April are two of the driest and warmest months in Costa Rica, which makes it a popular time to visit. The temperatures can be up into the nineties during the day, and the seventies at night. Light ocean breezes provide a warm balmy feel.

# LEADERSHIP

Global Leadership Adventures started as an educational institute, so we continue to think and act like educators—not tour operators—as we deliver life-changing programs. We intentionally weave a leadership curriculum into the daily experience on our programs. # **OUR EXPECTATIONS**

#### Be present

Our mission at GLA is "to inspire the next generation to realize their potential to transform the world and their role in it." To that end, we expect GLA students to maintain high standards of personal behavior and to be open-minded. The culture may be different, sometimes shockingly so. GLA will challenge students as they are expected to work hard and be present physically and mentally for all activities. We also ask students to take a step back from regular use of technology - particularly their smartphones - so as to maximize their engagement with the program and their fellow participants. Students may get hot, dirty and bug-bitten along the way, but their contribution can transform the community. The goal is for each student to return home having had a life-changing experience.

#### No tolerance
