MOROCCO: Cultural Kaleidoscope™

Uncover the secrets of magical Morocco as you immerse yourself in unique spices, meaningful service, and smiles you'll never forget.

OVERVIEW

On this program you will explore and spend time in four Moroccan cities—Rabat, Marrakesh, Casablanca and Oukaimeden, a small city at the foot of the Atlas Mountains—to acquire a holistic perspective on the intricacies of North African culture. With a distinctive mix of Arab, African, and European influence, Morocco is a colorful, fragrant and uniquely diverse country ripe for exploration. Through formal Arabic instruction and practicing with children in the summer camp at which you will volunteer, you'll be fully immersed in all that this country has to offer.

Volunteer your time at a summer camp for primary school students from underserved communities, where you'll do everything from teach simple English lessons to facilitate games or craft activities to assist with physical refurbishment projects.

SAMPLE ITINERARY: DAILY BREAKDOWN

Actual schedule of activities will vary by program session. The information detailed here is typical for what you can expect to experience; however, service work and activities vary depending upon the needs of our local community partners, various celebrations and customs, as well as the weather and specific needs of the student group.





DAY 1: WELCOME TO MOROCCO!

Touch down in Casablanca, where our staff will greet you with open arms! Travel by private bus to our first Home Base in Rabat before settling in, getting to know your fellow participants, and learning about your host country at orientation. Rabat is the capital city but has a calmer feel and coastal breezes, making it an ideal city in which to ease into Moroccan life.

DAY 2 - 3: ORIENTATION & INTRO TO SERVICE & EXPLORING RABAT

After orientation, We'll jump right into community service with an introduction at a *medina* (old city center) school and an afternoon at a refugee center. One afternoon we'll explore the coastal Kasbah des Oudayas, a fortified area perched where the Bouregreg River meets the Atlantic; take in the ocean views and spend time in the picturesque gardens there. We'll also tour the Chellah ruins, a medieval tomb site and trading post.

DAY 4: CASABLANCA

Today we'll rise early for a day trip to Casablanca, Morocco's largest city and home to the iconic Hassan II, the largest mosque in Africa. Built over a period of seven years and using the work of over 10,000 artists from the region, this decadent place of worship was built to commemorate the former king's 60th birthday. We'll return in the evening just in time for dinner at the Home Base and a session with our Mentor groups.

DAY 5: MARRAKESH & ATLAS MOUNTAINS

Back on the bus! This time we'll head south to Marrakesh for a morning of exploration. This city is known for its bustling, colorful *souks*, or marketplaces, full of winding passageways, street vendors and vibrant doorways. Shop for handcrafted goods or just browse the beautiful rugs and brass lanterns for which the region is famous. After touring the medina and enjoying a local lunch, we'll continue onward to our main









DAYS 6-10: SUMMER CAMP COMMUNITY SERVICE, ARABIC CLASSES & CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

We'll settle into our oasis guest house situated in a sleepy Berber village up in the Atlas mountains. This is where we'll begin our main community service project. Spend the week at a summer camp for primary school students, where we'll help facilitate programming, assist with physical school refurbishment projects and help students to learn and practice their English skills.

This is also the time for doing some language learning ourselves! In the afternoons we'll take classes in Modern Standard Arabic--these lessons will come in handy in our volunteer endeavors and when interacting with the small village community.

After service one day, we'll learn to make some traditional Moroccan fare! *Tajine*, a fragrant and flavorful baked dish made with couscous, vegetables, and meat, is named after the unique earthenware pot in which it's made.

DAY 11: HIKING EXCURSION

Today we'll explore some of the Atlas mountain range on foot. Spend the day hiking through rocky terrain filled with wildflowers and take in incredible views of the Atlas Mountains dotted with Berber villages. After the hike, we'll get steamy in a hammam, a traditional steam bath. In the evening, learn how to prepare traditional Moroccan food from local women in the community. We'll prepare and enjoy the evening meal together!

DAY 13: CAMEL RIDE & MARRAKESH MARKETPLACE

Bid our hosts and young students farewell--today we journey back to Marrakesh. Before we return to the city, we'll stop for a mini-adventure: camel ride! Camels (commonly known in Morocco "ships of the desert") have been an important part of Moroccan culture and commerce for thousands of years. Pull in those core muscles and maintain your balance while their dangly legs take you on a journey through the palms and dusty sand.

Afterwards, we'll continue on our way to Marrakesh. Visit the Bahia Palace, famous for its intricate tilework and lush gardens. We'll also make a stop at El Badi Palace, then wrap up the day with some last-minute shopping and farewell dinner. Put your Arabic to the test as you haggle in the souks and say *beslama* (goodbye) to our local staff.

DAY 14: DEPARTURE

Unfortunately, our Moroccan adventure must come to an end! Head to the airport today with memories that will last a lifetime and new language skills to practice back home. Staff will assist students with checking in and accompany them until they have safely departed for their gates.

TRAVELING TO MOROCCO

GLA HOME BASE | Our main Home Base is a cozy guesthouse in the Oukaimeden valley, surrounded by hills and equipped with a large outdoor patio, swimming pool, and shared, gender-segregated bedrooms.

FOOD | Morocco is well-known for its cuisine, which is a mix of Berber, Arabic, Andalusian, and Mediterranean influence. Dishes made with couscous, vegetables such as squash and eggplant, lentil, and flatbread are very common. Moroccan dishes have a lot of spice (ginger, cumin, turmeric, saffron) but not a lot of heat.

CLIMATE | Be prepared for heat! Rabat, Casablanca, and Marrakesh, all in the lowlands, can experience extreme dry heat in the summer months, with daytime temperatures from the mid-90s to low 100s (F). In Oukaimeden in the High Atlas Mountains, the temperature is a bit cooler, with a daytime average of 90 degrees in July.

LEADERSHIP

Global Leadership Adventures started as an educational institute, so we continue to think and act like educators—not tour operators—as we deliver life-changing programs. We intentionally weave a leadership curriculum into the daily experience on our programs. Our Expectations

Be present

Our mission at GLA is "to inspire the next generation to realize their potential to transform the world and their role in it."
